

Art runs in Sabina's family. The great-granddaughter of a noted German sculptor who created the "Bremen Horsemen"; daughter of a ballerina mother, and of a father who was responsible for the sets on the original "Star Trek" TV series and built the Enterprise stage set. Sabina was drawn to art as a child, at the age of eight she began studying at the Art Institute of Chicago. After moving to California, she took classes with Guy Diehl and Jack Ward at Chabot College, Jade Fon at Diablo Valley College, and was able to study with other notable artists associated with the "California School of Watercolor" such as Gerald Brommer, Mario Cooper, Dong Kingman and Millard Sheets. More recently she has studied oil painting with Jeffery Watts, and attended American Artist's "Weekend With The Masters". Her greatest mentor, however, was Juan Pena with whom she spent many years studying classical portrait from live models.



"Painting in watercolor and oils, I try to capture the life around me. The thread of life that runs through the created world that is so fascinating. Each being is unique and influences their surroundings while here." Starting from a limited palette she produces paintings that are saturated with color, pattern and texture, combining brilliant hues with muted tones to create a shimmering tapestry of pigment.

"To capture that essence in that moment and share it with those who view my paintings keeps me working and stretching my art. Just as life is not static, my work should be a moving, dynamic, growing expression."

Sabina is a Signature Member of National Watercolor Society and Watercolor West. She is also a member of Amador County Artists Association, American Watercolor Society, California Art Club, and Oil Painters of America. Her work can be seen at Windrush Gallery in Sedona, Arizona; Gallery 10 in Sutter Creek California; or at her studio in Fiddletown, CA.
